

Some Christian leaders gather a coterie of confused Christians, and they're conned into doing what they're told Jesus would do.

These activists get plenty of hate without the spiritual life benefits. Satan encourages Christian activism because it's part of the cosmic system.

In fact, Satan uses such activism to discredit the Bible and promote syncretistic Christianity.

These believers become Christian losers. They fail to execute God's will, plan, and purpose for the Church Age, even though they have equal opportunity to do so.

A Christian loser is negative towards the study of Bible Doctrine. They opt for emotionalism: the feel-good approach.

The loser is the believer who fails to execute the greatest spiritual life of all human history, the spiritual life of the Church age.

If, as a believer, you fail to learn and metabolize Bible Doctrine, it will result in the failure to deploy the problem-solving devices on the defense line of the soul.

PRINCIPLE: [The loser believer does not fulfill God's plan for his life after salvation.](#)

The loser believer, after accepting Jesus Christ as their Savior, has no spiritual life as an extension of his spiritual birth.

The loser believer has wrong priorities and spends his life in the cosmic system.

The loser believer either never finds his right pastor or, if he does, because he is involved in the cosmic system, never gets serious about studying under them; he just visits occasionally.

If the loser believer does get serious under his right pastor, he is serious only until he gets distracted by the lure of the world or a more emotional experience at some denomination.

This loser does not lose his salvation, but fails to execute the protocol plan of God by which God is glorified in time, and escrow blessings are distributed in time and eternity.

Loser believers, instead of becoming an invisible hero in the angelic conflict, become bored, dissatisfied, preoccupied with self, arrogant, frustrated, distracted, unstable, and unable to utilize the ten problem solving devices.

Further, legalism or self-righteous arrogance produces crusader arrogance.

We find the warning to the Christian loser in 2 John 8-9.

**2 John 8-9: “Look out for yourselves that you may not lose your momentum which you have accomplished, but that you may receive a full reward.”**

**Vs. 9: No one has fellowship with God who keeps advancing out-of-bounds and does not remain on the playing field through the doctrine of Christ. The believer who perseveres in doctrine, this believer has fellowship with both the Father and the Son.”**

The warning is that if you lose your momentum, if you get out of fellowship and stay out of fellowship, if you grieve and quench the Holy Spirit, then you are going to lose those fantastic escrow blessings that are a part of your portfolio of invisible assets.

When we are out of fellowship, we are grieving or quenching the Holy Spirit. However, when we rebound, we get back on the playing field.

What are the characteristics of the Christian loser?

1. He is described in Galatians 5:4: “You have been alienated from Christ; you have drifted off course from grace.”
  2. He is described in Hebrews 12:15 as: “Coming short of the grace of God.”
  3. He is described as a “The tormented soul” in 2 Peter 2:7-9, “And if He rescued righteous Lot, oppressed by the sexual conduct of unprincipled men (for what he saw and heard as a righteous man living among them, he felt his righteous soul tormented day after day with their lawless deeds {homosexuality}), then the Lord knows how to rescue the spiritual man from testing, and to keep the unrighteous under punishment for the day of judgment.”
- A. Whenever you are surrounded by degeneracy and you have some system of righteousness in your soul, the degeneracy becomes a torment to the soul of the loser believer.

- B. Lot was in a constant state of being upset. Torment of the soul does not solve the problem. We have the solution by growing in grace as individual believers.
  - C. Any loser believer who has any system of righteousness (such as establishment righteousness, capacity righteousness, or spiritual righteousness), and does not have the problem-solving devices in place, is going to be constantly tormented (irritated to the point of torment, self-torture).
4. He is described as “**the lukewarm believer**” in Revelation 3:15-16. The lukewarm believer was once hot but has cooled down.
  5. He is described as “**a shipwrecked believer**” in 1 Timothy 1:19, “**Having doctrine and a good conscience, which some believers have pushed aside, in fact they have become shipwrecked concerning their faith.**”
  6. He is described as “**the flawed believer**” in James 1:23-24.

What are the descriptions of the loser believer?

1. The carnal believer. Romans 8:7; 1 Corinthians 3:1-3

1 Corinthians 3:1-3: “**And I, brethren, could not speak unto you as unto spiritual, but as unto carnal, even as unto babes in Christ.**”

Vs.2: **I have fed you with milk, and not with meat: for up to now you were not able to bear it, neither yet now are you able.**

Vs.3: **For you are yet carnal: for whereas there is among you envying, and strife, and divisions, are you not carnal, and walk as men?”**

2. Prisoner to the law of sin. Romans 7:23

Romans 7:23: “**But I see a different law in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin which is in my members.**”

3. A wretched believer. Romans 7:24

Romans 7:24: **“Wretched man that I am! Who will set me free from the body of this death?”**

4. The fulfillment of the lusts of the flesh. Galatians 5:16-21

Galatians 5:16-21: **“But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh.**

Vs.17: **For the flesh sets its desire against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; for these are in opposition to one another, so that you may not do the things that you please.**

Vs.18: **But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the Law.**

Vs.19: **Now the deeds of the flesh are evident, which are: immorality, impurity, sensuality,**

Vs.20: **idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, disputes, dissensions, factions,**

Vs.21: **envying, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these, of which I forewarn you, just as I have forewarned you, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.”**

5. Grieving the Holy Spirit. Ephesians 4:30

Ephesians 4:30: **“Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.”**

6. Quenching the Holy Spirit. 1 Thessalonians 5:19

1 Thessalonians 5:19: **“Do not quench the Spirit;”**

7. The enemy of the cross. Philippians 3:18

Philippians 3:18: **“For many walk, of whom I often told you, and now tell you even weeping, that they are enemies of the cross of Christ,”**

8. The enemy of God. James 4:4

James 4:4: **“You adulteresses, do you not know that friendship with the world is hostility toward God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.”**

PRINCIPLE: Believers can get so wrapped up in politics that they become a neurotic believer. Deuteronomy 28:28

Colonel R. B. Thieme, Jr. said, “there are two approaches to problem solving on a national scale: pivot and power politics.

If you are involved in “pivot politics,” you know that this is the divine solution to the problems of life. It includes the following:

1. Regeneration.
2. Advancing in the plan of God through perception and application of Bible Doctrine.
3. Growing to spiritual maturity and becoming part of the pivot, which preserves a city, state, nation.
4. It also adheres to principles of freedom and advocates the function of the laws of divine establishment in the national entity.

If you get involved in “power politics,” you are involved in human and Satanic solution to problems.

1. “Power politics” is the concept of “social action” to effect change within a city, state, or nation.
2. It uses peace and love propaganda to achieve its goals, and it stops people from thinking.
3. If this doesn’t work, they resort to violence, tyranny, terror, and revolution to achieve their ends when people resist their propaganda.
4. Many believers become distracted from the plan of God by “power politics.”

Pivot politics prepares the believer for the crisis through perception of Bible Doctrine, so that the faith-rest drill functions in claiming promises and coming to doctrinal conclusions.

God uses prepared people in the crisis who know how to apply doctrine to the situation for divine solutions.

The larger the pivot, the greater the blessing, prosperity, and effectiveness of the client nation.

A client nation flourishes when its citizens function under a system of pivot politics. When, over time, the loss of thought metastasizes into bedlam, then the system declines into power politics.

In general, what human governments have rarely been able to adopt and, if having done so, to maintain, is pivot politics, confirmed by history's record of the gospel's missionary journey. The term "pivot" has several definitions but its meaning with regard to a client nation is defined as:

That upon which something depends; the central, cardinal, or crucial factor, member, part, or person.<sup>5</sup>

In the Thieme Bible Doctrine Dictionary it is defined as follows:

(a) Within a national entity, an accumulation of believers whose spiritual advance determines client-nation status; (b) the nucleus of spiritual heroes that furthers the plan of God for mankind, influences the course of human history, and provides prosperity and protection to the client nation through blessing by association (Matt. 5:13a). The illustrative term pivot is the counterpart to the Old Testament term "remnant," used in reference to faithful believers of Jewish nations (2 Kings 19:30; Isa. 10:20–22).

As a national citizen, the Christian is responsible for becoming part of the pivot. It is his obligation to live by the power of the Holy Spirit; advance to spiritual maturity through perception, metabolizing, and application of Bible doctrine; and become an invisible hero who contributes to national blessing and preservation. Pivotism is the opposite of activism, which arrogantly tries to 'Christianize' society through public action, ultimately becoming part of the degeneracy that warrants judgment upon the land.

A believer in the pivot recognizes that there is no greater system for serving God and country than executing the unique spiritual life of this age. With doctrine in the soul, the pivot believer reflects the glory of God upon a lost and dying world (Matt. 5:14–16), and the blessings he receives from the Lord benefit his nation. This is the invisible, spiritual impact on history for which the

Church is designed. A large pivot of invisible heroes means strength and prosperity in the government, law enforcement, military, economy, culture, and social life of the entire nation. But if the pivot shrinks beyond a certain point, impact is lost; the client nation declines and is eventually destroyed through the cycles of divine discipline (Hosea 4:1–3). Unbelievers and reversionists in the land are caught up in the waves of historical disaster, while the remaining pivot members are shielded by the unfailing care of God (Ps. 33:18–22; 46:1–11; Isa. 37:31–38).

The biblical application refers to the pivot as the accumulation of mature believers living in a client nation under civil government in a specific geographical location.

The biblical pivot includes the categories of mature believers and also those who are positive to Bible Doctrine and are consistently advancing toward spiritual maturity.

These believers are in contrast to believers associated with the cosmic system, including the systems of arrogance, hatred, and reversionism. Among these are those who spin off into a soul status that overtly cannot be distinguished from unbelievers.<sup>6</sup>

These types make up those who become involved in crusader arrogance, civil disobedience, property damage, etc.

Those involved in pivot politics find their solution through a personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ.

They are advancing to spiritual maturity; they are using the Faith Rest Drill and the Problem-Solving Devices to handle the problems of the day.

If, however, you are involved in power politics, you are using human viewpoint and you approach what's going on in our nation with compromise and alliance with the enemy.

Pivot politics emphasizes grace and divine viewpoint, while power politics emphasizes arrogance, self-righteousness, humanism and change.

What change do we see with power politics?
